Entertainment and festivals

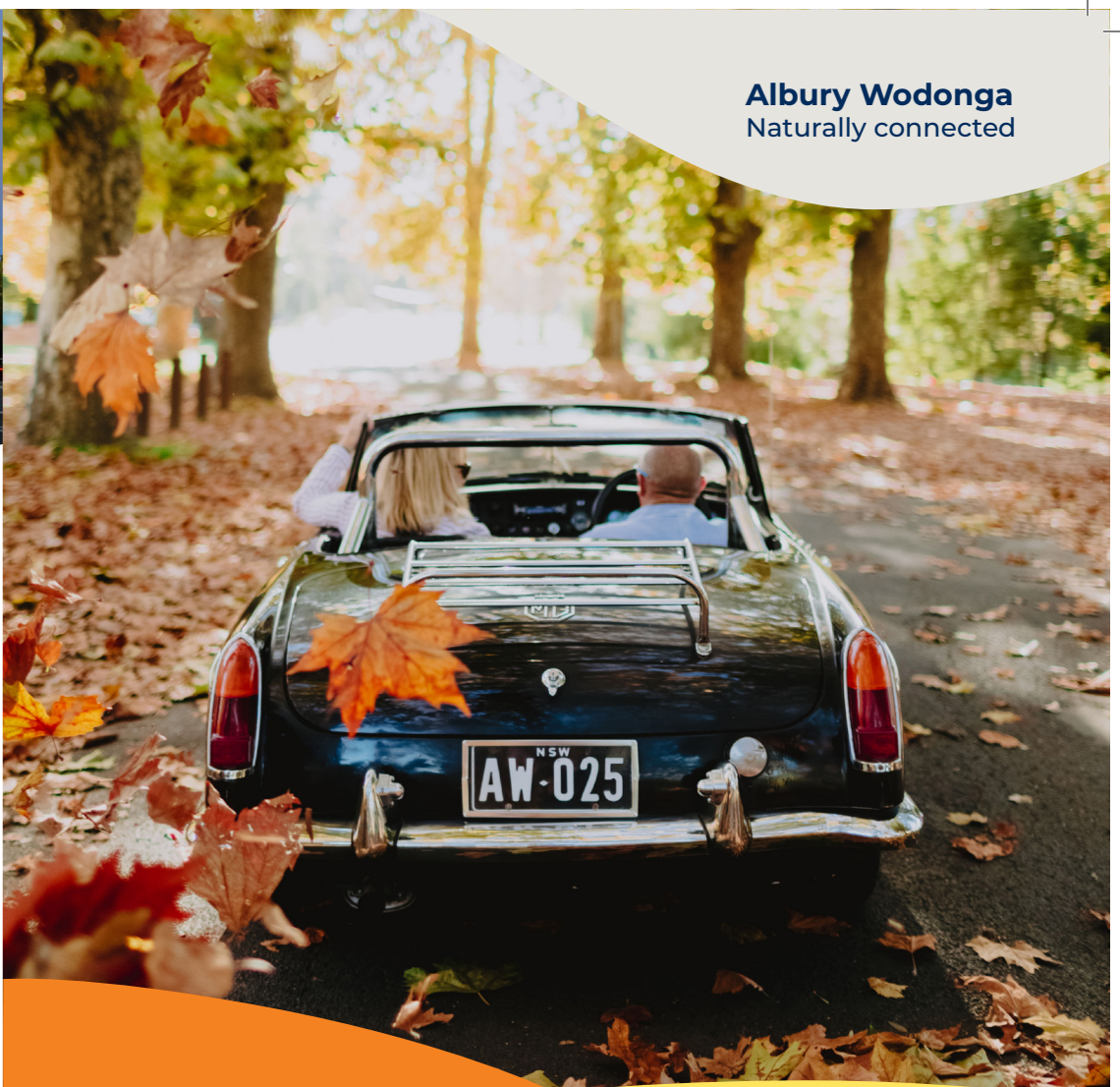
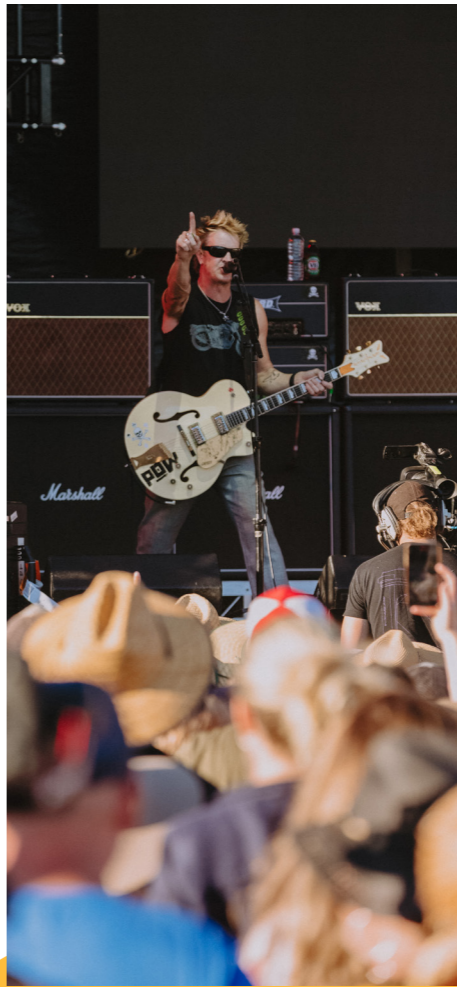
From musicals and concerts, to comedy shows and stage plays, Albury Wodonga offers a wide range of live performances across its venues.

Tracks and trails

Bike, hike or simply stroll your way through 100+ kilometres of diverse trails connecting Albury Wodonga's incredible parks and reserves. Spanning from the vast **Wonga Wetlands**, through to the south of Albury, **The Wagirra Trail** winds along the banks of the Murray River.

While on the path be sure to check out the **Yindymarra Sculpture Walk** and continue onto **The Crossing Place Trail** to explore local Aboriginal sculptures and learn about the significant history of the area.



Beyond the lake

Holding six times the volume of Sydney Harbour, **Lake Hume** is an easy 15-minute drive from the city centres and a must-see on any Albury Wodonga itinerary.

A mecca for boating, fishing, swimming and watersports, the lake is picture perfect from sunrise to sunset.

Take a scenic ride, walk or drive around the waters edge, enjoy the views from numerous lookouts and learn about the incredible history and function of the **Hume Dam Wall**.



The catch of a lifetime

Did you know Australia's largest exclusively freshwater fish lives right here on the **Murray River**? The legendary Murray Cod has long featured in Aboriginal stories and continues to be a prized catch amongst recreational anglers. Chase the famous fish right here, in season from 1 December to 31 August, don't forget your NSW fishing license.

Whether it's a salted caramel martini from **Temperance and General**, or a local brew from **The Goods Shed** calling your name, Albury Wodonga has an endless list of places to raise a glass.

Historic gem, **Brady's Railway Hotel**, offers an authentic pub experience and a great playground for the kids, while the **Astor Hotel's** open fire pit is the perfect spot to pull up for the afternoon. Find live music, trivia and special events held weekly across the border. There really is something for everyone.

Art and history lovers

Make your way through the latest exhibition at the **Albury LibraryMuseum**, or enjoy the connection of art and literature at **Hyphen - Wodonga Library Gallery** – insiders tip, their gift shop is delightful for art lovers.

Open 363 days a year, family-friendly and free, **Murray Art Museum Albury (MAMA)** combines heritage buildings with contemporary architecture and is home to ever-changing exhibitions.

No visit is complete without a stop at **Bonegilla Migrant Experience**. One in 20 Australians have a link to Bonegilla Migrant Camp, yet few know about this post WWII immigration centre, found right here next to Lake Hume.



For a fascinating insight into our past, pick up an **Albury CBD Historic Walking Tour** map from the Visitor Information Centre and embark on a self-guided trip through time. Circle past the prominent Art Deco T&G Tower, in the heart of Albury, before visiting the heritage-listed Albury Railway Station, featuring the longest covered train platform in the southern hemisphere at more than 450 metres long.

Laneways and hidden gems

Home to local boutiques, independent labels, big brands and everything in between, Albury Wodonga has some truly beautiful stores to explore. **Di Billiet Homewares** is a hidden gem brimming with colourful decor and gifts, while **Zeinert and Co.** will have you dressed to impress and decked out in all sorts of jewels.

When the bags are full and the shopping is done, the gracious team at **Basq Urban Spa and Beauty** will pamper you into a blissful state.



Breakfast, lunch and dinner

Start your day at **Piccolo Pod**. This unique shipping container café in Wodonga is renowned for their excellent coffee and pastries, or enjoy brunch with a view at **The River Deck Café**.

La Maison Restaurant provides a cosy, intimate setting in a classic bluestone cottage, while **Downtown Pizzeria** serves up delicious wood-fired pizzas and hearty pastas. If warm fires and fine dining is more your style, **Level One Wine Bar** offers a seasonal menu paired with an extensive wine list and **Yardbird's** refined dining experience with European-inspired dishes cooked in a Mibrasa wood-fired oven are sure to impress.
